The 2026 Panson Cup League begins its fifth year of play on Thursday, April 30 from 6-9 PM, and will continue each Thursday into July. Named in honor of Regency pickleball pioneer Barry Panson, the Cup is symbolic of pickleball supremacy and bragging rights within our community. The championship game is projected for the evening of July 16 and no later than July 30 in an attempt to finish earlier than 2025 to avoid August’s heat and humidity.

The much anticipated Regency at Monroe Pickleball Club Tournament is scheduled to begin on Thursday, August 27 from 6-9 PM, and then continue on Saturday, August 29 and Sunday, August 30 from 9 AM-6 PM. Registration for this popular competition which includes men’s doubles, women’s doubles, and mixed doubles will open in July. If you’re wondering why there is no play on Friday evening, August 28, the HOA is hosting its Summer hot dog night.

While clinics and competitive events represent the cake, the Club's social events provide the icing. Meg Pribyl, Board Chair for Events, with help from her dedicated committee, has developed a robust calendar of socials that include a blend of previous favorites and some new and innovative ideas. Remember, this is the Club that never sleeps and runs events throughout the year. For example, the second annual Winter Warmup, two hours of indoor, temperature controlled pickleball fun takes place on Saturday, February 7, at Pickleball Kingdom in Hamilton, NJ.

As we head into Spring, members can look forward to BBQ Night on April 29, which signals the start of Panson Cup League play the next day, Oktoberfest on October 9, Ralph's Italian Ices Social on August 17, and two Game Days, a new concept that combines pickleball with canasta and/or mah-jongg plus lunch in between. This is just a small slice of a much bigger pie.

While these events offer fun, value, and excitement, they would be irrelevant without Club members. Ensuring that membership is grown and sustained is the purview of Board Chair for Membership Noreen Gumnick. Having recently joined the Board in November 2025, along with Meg Pribyl, Noreen's insight and fresh thinking are paying dividends by attracting new members who want to play, compete, and socialize.
